

Ramadan Facts

Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. It is a special and holy month when Muslims around the world fast from sunrise to sunset.

Fasting helps Muslims feel closer to Allah (God), practice self-discipline, and remember those who don't have enough food. It is also one of the Five Pillars of Islam.

Ramadan follows the lunar calendar, so it begins when the new moon is sighted. That's why the start and end dates change every year!

Eid al-Fitr is a special holiday that marks the end of Ramadan, the Islamic month of fasting.

People give a donation called Zakat al-Fitr to help those in need



Eid al-Fitr is celebrated on the first day of Shawwal, the month that comes after Ramadan in the Islamic calendar. The exact date changes every year because it follows the lunar calendar (based on the moon).

Eid al-Fitr Facts

Muslims go to the mosque for a special Eid prayer.


People greet each other with "Eid Mubarak," meaning "Blessed Eid."

Since Eid marks the end of fasting, families prepare special meals and sweet treats.




Why is Giving Important on Eid?
